We received 83 questionnaires. Thirty comments were also added to the questionnaires. These can be found on the school website.

What was clear from the questionnaires is that we still have some work to do;

- We will be reviewing the Anti-bullying policy with School Council who will help to re-write this policy. A group of six children from Year 5 will be attending a conference on Anti-bullying strategies with Mrs Tomlinson and Mrs Williams in April 2019. We will let you know how this has gone and update you on what new strategies will be introduced. Loud Mouth Theatre company in the Summer term will be visiting to lead assemblies and workshops on bullying. The NSPCC are booked to lead assemblies and workshops on March 14th and again on the 21st to talk about safety and what to do if children have worries or concerns.
- We will be reviewing the homework policy. This will be done during the Summer term. We recognise that homework projects have a place and for many children they really enjoy participating in these but also that they can cause stress and anxiety on busy family lives. We will try to get this balance better for you.
- Where you have worries or concerns about your child please talk to the class teacher in the first instance. If you feel this is not resolving the situation, please do not hesitate to speak to one of the office staff to arrange an appointment. I am frequently on the playground at the start or end of the school day so that concerns or worries can be shared. Mrs Williams, the parent support advisor, is now based in the front office and she is able to offer support and advice on a wide range of subjects.
- The Behaviour Policy is in draft format and will shortly be sent to you. We will also share this with the children as there will be some changes to the systems we have in place. Where there are concerns about a child's behaviour we will talk to a parent/carer at the earliest point. If needed, we will use other agencies to provide expertise and guidance.
