Thank you to all who took the time to complete the recent survey to help us think about how we can make further improvements to Red Hall Primary School. We received 89 responses. This is three more than the last time we sent out a survey.

Thank you to the 27 of you who took the time to provide us with further feedback.

Seven of the comments were about our communication systems. This is something we will certainly reflect upon and consider how we develop this further to make improvements. We use a range of communication systems as we know that with our families there are a variety of ways that people interact and like to receive communications. It is clear that many, of you would like us to be more consistent in our approach and that you are happy that we should use SchoolLife more frequently.

Thank you if you made positive comments about individuals or teams – these have been passed on and are always warmly received.

In response to the cancelled Progress Meetings with your child's class teacher, these will be rescheduled in due course. We understand the importance of these and will update you.

Two comments were made about the fencing on the KS2 site. The fencing installed is anti-climb fencing. A single incident did occur and very prompt action was taken by the staff in responding and followed our Lock Down Process. The trees that are adjacent to the school fence are under the jurisdiction of the local authority and we have requested that the trees are lopped to help prevent a further incident like this occurring. We understand the concern that many children and families had with this incident and we have provided support as necessary. If there are any families who feel they need further support, please ask for this. The police have been contacted regarding this incident and details passed on.



The responses about where you would like help and support will help us to plan out workshops over the next term and a half:


