English

In English we will be continuing to develop pupils' fluency and comprehension skills through daily English lessons and guided reading sessions. Pupils will continue to read, enjoy and discuss a range of high-quality age-appropriate texts across a variety of genres. Our class book for the summer term is Darwin's Dragons. We will continue to look at a wide variety of texts as part of guided reading which will test the pupils' prediction and inference skills.

The children will be writing fiction, non-fiction and poetry texts. The first half term will see the pupils analyse and create a balanced argument, before creating newspaper reports linked to our topic. Our writing skills are then applied throughout the curriculum and in free-writing opportunities.

Spelling, punctuation and grammar curriculum requirements will also be a key focus.

History and Geography

For this term our topic in Geography is Economic Activity in the UK. We will be identifying the regions of the United Kingdom and how economic activity is distributed due to physical and human geography.
