What are we doing to reward good attendance?

- We will be continuing to give all children who are present for 100% of the week a raffle ticket every Friday. A prize draw takes place in the last assembly of half term, with a prize each for Key Stage 1 and 2. The more raffle tickets a child has, the more chance they will have to win.
- There will now be attendance reward events. The first week of each half term we will be holding an attendance reward event with the invites given out to those children who have attended at least 97% of that half term. This will be based on each half term, so every child should be able to attend. There will be an event with music playing as well as a quiet room with movies or games for children who like things a bit quieter!
- Bronze certificates and badge will be given out at the end of Autum term for any who has 97% for above.
- Bronze and Silver will be given out at the end of the Spring term.
- Gold, Silver and Bronze will be given out at the end of he Summer term.
- Children can collect all <u>3 badges</u> if they attend at least 97% attendance by the end of the school year and a special 100% badge for any children who attend 100% of the year.

We believes this gives every child the opportunity to be recognised for their fantastic attitude to being in school every day, supporting their learning.
