English

Language and communication

In English we will be continuing to develop pupils' use of 'Talk for Writing'. The children will be writing fiction, non-fiction and poetry texts. At the start of the half term, we will be exploring setting description, which links with our Roman theme in guided reading. We will move onto a new unit of news report writing, then build upon our prior knowledge of non-chronological reports, diary entry. For poetry this term we will be focusing on a narrative poem and performance poetry.

Spelling, punctuation and grammar curriculum requirements will also be a key focus throughout all of our written work.

Computing - Connecting computers

Children will be developing their understanding of digital flashcards in term 1. This will include looking through algorithms, programming Micro bits to show images, improving programs and exploring more ways to program a Micro bit.

Followed by events and actions in programs in term 2 builds on this by exploring different programming site and debugging programs.

Science

In the first half term the children will continue with our unit of forces and magnets which will dive into why objects moving along a surface, the effects of a force from a magnet, magnets attracting and repelling.

They will then move on to exploring plants, recapping prior learning from year 2, explaining what a plant needs to survive then continue to identify and describe the functions of the different parts of plants. They will explore what plants need for life and growth. Children will then complete an investigation to see how water is transported through plants. Children will also look at seeds and explore the different ways that plants disperse their seeds.

<u>Maths</u>

STEM

In maths this term the units we will be covering are, firstly, we will be continuing our learning with fractions, where we will recap our prior learning, moving on to adding and subtracting fractions. We will move onto money, with a focus on finding change from an amount. Then we will explore time, recapping prior learning from year 2 and expanding our knowledge to tell time within the minute.

In the second half of the term we will be explore statistics calling on our year 2 knowledge to interpret data from a range of resources. We will move onto shape, looking at different angles; comparing and drawing them. As well as recapping 2D and 3D shapes.
