Nursery - Traditional Tales

This term in Nursery, we are enjoying a range of traditional stories starting with 'The Three Billy Goat's Gruff', 'Three Little Pigs' and 'Goldilocks and The Three Bears'. The children will be learning to become great story tellers and will be creating fun, alternative endings.



Reception - The World and Beyond

Fostering Independence.

Children who are independent make better learners!

You can support your child at home in becoming more independent by encouraging them to do small tasks like putting on their coats, shoes and socks all by themselves. Thank you for your continued support.

Named clothing

We understand children will be returning to school in January with extra items of warmer clothing - hats, gloves etc. Please ensure these items are named as it is often these smaller items that go missing.



Wellies & Waterproofs

We are continually learning in our outdoor environment. We do this in all weathers. If you haven't done so already, please send in a pair of wellies and a waterproof suit, **with names on please!**



Your child should also bring a named bottle of water to school. No fizzy drinks allowed.



Spare clothes

Please could you ensure your child has a small bag of spare clothes in case of accidents (including messy play!) This can remain in school on your child's peg. If you have any items of clothing that you no longer need, we will always welcome donations. Thank you!

Reception will have PE on Mondays. They should come to school in PE kit on this day.

30 Hours session - 9:00am-3:10pm

Reception timings:

Door opens at 8:40am.

Our learning begins at 9:10am. If your child arrives after this time, they are missing learning time.

School finishes at 3:20pm.

Maths

Nursery:

Children will learn lots of number songs & rhymes and be encouraged to join in. Children will be focussing on numerals to 5, the composition of numbers and counting.

They will also begin to look at measures, height and length, mass and capacity.

Reception:

Children will be looking at the composition of numbers to 5 and comparing groups of numbers. They will learn about the numbers 6-10 and practise combining 2 groups and adding more. They will look at ordering numbers to 10 and counting backwards.

Children will also learn about capacity, measuring ingredients, measuring and comparing height and measuring time.



We use Evidence Me to record your child's learning in school. You can access this online or by downloading the app from the Google Play or the App store and signing up via the link we send you.

Every Monday, you will receive a weekly update with key information for the week and any observations of your child from the previous week.

Don't forget... You can add photo/video observations to your child's learning journey using Evidence Me. We love to see the experiences the children have outside of school!
